



Climate Change Negotiations Training Workshop for NUS and Singapore Youth

Background

The National University of Singapore (herein referred to as 'NUS' or 'the University') was admitted as a Research and Independent Non-Governmental Organization (RINGO) to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (FCCC) on 10 December 2014, at COP20 in Lima. The Energy Studies Institute (ESI) is the designated contact point for NUS and the official channel for the exchange of information with the UNFCCC secretariat. ESI staff have been attending COP negotiations since 2011. In 2015 and 2016, ESI brought a total of 5 students from NUS and Yale-NUS College to attend the climate talks in Paris and Marrakech. At both sessions, together with the Singapore Youth for Climate Action, NUS participated in meetings with members of the Singapore delegation and breakfast dialogues with Singapore's Minister for Environment and Water Resources Mr. Masagos Zukifli.

"Before attending COP21, I have heard of the Kyoto Protocol and Montreal Protocol which were very briefly touched on during my secondary and post-secondary studies... Introduction to the Workshop

Participants are required to attend 4 out of the 6 sessions of this workshop. The sessions are 2 hours each, every Monday (except for Session 3, which is on a Tuesday) from 6-8pm at The Red Box. The last and final session will be held at Ridge View Residential College. The last workshop session is mandatory, and will run for 3 hours, as it will include presentations by participants on what they have learnt and intend to do beyond the workshops. This serves to enrich the knowledge of all participants and to provide a platform for potential collaboration. The workshop schedules are tabled below. Topics/guest speakers may be interchanged for a particular week. All participants will be informed of any changes in advance.





Session 1 - Monday, 13 August 2018, 6-8pm @ The Red Box

Introduction to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change & the Paris Agreement (*Melissa Low, Research Fellow, Energy Studies Institute, NUS*)

This session will cover the basics of international climate change policy, including the UNFCCC, Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement and its Paris Agreement Work Programme (PAWP).

Session 2 – Monday, 20 August 2018, 6-8pm @ The Red Box

The Role of Youth

(Melissa Low, Research Fellow, ESI, NUS & representative from Singapore Youth for Climate Action)

This session will consider the role of youth at the international climate talks and introduce the youth constituency Youth NGOs or YOUNGOs.

<u>Session 3 – Tuesday, 28 August 2018, 6-8pm @ The Red Box</u> (*Note that this session is not on Monday) National Perspectives on Climate Change (Melissa Low, Research Fellow, Energy Studies Institute, NUS)

This session will look at the major negotiating positions at the UNFCCC and focus on national perspectives on climate change, including that of major emitters like the United States and China, and negotiating blocs like the European Union, G77 & China, African Group, Arab Group, and Least Developed Countries etc.

<u>Session 4 – Online Forum</u> Tracking the Negotiations

In the week of 3 September 2018, there will be UNFCCC negotiations in Bangkok. Workshop participants will be tasked to track talks on the Paris Agreement Work Programme and participate in an online forum. <u>Session 5 – Monday, 10 September 2018, 6-8pm @ The Red Box</u> Singapore's Participation at the UNFCCC (Melissa Low, Research Fellow, Energy Studies Institute, NUS)

This session will cover Singapore's efforts at the UNFCCC talks and discuss the importance of its wholeof-government approach towards meeting its reporting obligations.

<u>Session 6 – Monday, 17 September 2018, 6-9pm @ Ridge View Residential College</u> (Mandatory) Participant presentations & Conclusion

At this session, participants will have the opportunity to share what they have learnt and intend to do beyond the workshops, as well as discuss potential collaboration.
